As a team, we work amongst poor, vulnerable and marginalised communities in the disease areas of Leprosy, Lymphatic Filariasis (LF), HIV/AIDS, Tuberculosis, Eye Care etc. with Leprosy and LF as our key focus areas. We offer free end-to-end services for the people affected by Leprosy, LF and other neglected diseases. These services range from awareness generation, case detection, treatment, counselling, surgery, disability care and livelihood support. Our 16 referral centres across the country serve as a beacon of hope for the affected people.

Mentionable Updates

- Our collaboration with **Rotary Clubs** has been initiated successfully and will be intensified in the future with project-specific partnerships with rotary clubs in all our operational areas. We envision that this is going to be one of the game changer partnerships for LEpra.
- Our project with **Raghu Raj and Vimal Foundation** in Kalahandi continues to progress from strength-to-strength and we are hoping that our partnership continues in the near future.
- **American Leprosy Missions** - We are very proud to share that **Jagruti Livelihoods** is a first of its kind livelihood pilot project which is a joint initiative of American Leprosy Missions (ALM) & LEpra.



Through this project, we initiated a for-profit, women-led, social enterprise of sanitary napkin marketing and sales for women in marginalised communities of Mentada block in Andhra Pradesh.

- COVID19 tests are being carried out successfully through our research centre at Hyderabad.

Andhra Pradesh

- Our mobile footwear van which goes to hard-to-reach areas, manufactures 154 pairs of customised footwear and handed over to the beneficiaries.
- 2,345 households were visited by the Community Resource Persons (CRP) and made aware on hand wash, vector control aspects and safe drinking water.

Bihar

- 489 leprosy affected persons availed services at our referral centres and 115 pairs of customised footwear were distributed.
- 221 persons affected with lymphatic filariasis were provided customised footwear.

Madhya Pradesh

- 389 ration & hygiene kits were distributed to the people affected by leprosy.
- 345 families were sensitised on COVID19 awareness.
- 56 persons affected with leprosy were provided with customised footwear.

Odisha

- 218 persons affected with leprosy were provided with customised footwear.
- 168 school children were sensitised on hand-wash, safe drinking water and personal hygiene.
- Various activities were carried out by our team on the observance of World AIDS Day 2020 on Dec 1st.

Telangana

- 256 persons affected with leprosy availed service at our referral centres and 57 pairs of customised footwear were distributed.
- The mobile footwear van covered 6 villages to provide customised footwear to the persons affected by leprosy & LF.
