About Lymphatic Filariasis



The disease is caused by a parasite transmitted by mosquito bites. The parasite larva develops into an adult worm inside the body. The worms block lymphatic vessels, accumulating fluid in tissues, especially in the legs and scrotum. Early detection with mild swelling can be resolved with treatment.

Andhra Pradesh & Telangana

- In association with 'Fairmed', initiated provision of selfcare kits to persons affected by leprosy.
- 3,450 customised footwear for Telangana govt. and 800 pairs for AP govt. are bring manufactured.

Bihar

- Multi-Drug Therapy (MDT) for leprosy affected people has been supplied in 9 districts.
- Through our mobile van, 227 pairs of cutomised footwear have been provided to the leprosy affected.
- 1000 ration kits have been distributed with the support from Rising Star Outreach of India.

Mahanadi Netra Chikitsalaya (MNC)

• 119 cataract surgeries have been performed.

Madhya Pradesh

- 22 reaction cases of leprosy were treated and a total of 171 customised footwear have been manufactured and distributed.
- 983 dry ration kits have been distributed in three leprosy colonies supported by Rising Star Outreach of India.

Odisha

- Distribution of dry ration, emergency medicines and PPE kits to key population in Bhubaneswar and Puri.
- All the referral centers and services were functional during the lockdown period.

Research - Around 780 people were vaccinated and educated about COVID19 precautions & vaccination importance.

Let me start by expressing my deep sadness at the sudden demise of Prof. Radhamohan ji. He has been associated with LEPRA for a long time and had been a renowned environmentalist and social worker in the state of Odisha who was awarded Padma Shri last year. With the COVID19 pandemic still raging through, most of our regular activities last month were affected, but none of the referral centers/clinics were closed. We distributed dry ration and provided other emergency assistance in all our operational areas to reduce the impact of pandemic on our beneficiaries. Now, with easing of restrictions, our community based activities have started in most of our project locations. It was good to see LEPRA colleagues training the government Leprosy staff of Zambia remotely. Our vaccination project supported by Lepra UK has had a great impact and we have been able to facilitate vaccination journeys of 15,000+ beneficiaries in vulnerable communities and we continue to reach more. I would also like to add that we have managed to establish an Oxygen Plant supported by Juhar Foundation at our eye hospital Mahanadi Netra Chikitsalaya (MNC) at Sonepur in Odisha.
