# **FEW ACTIVITY UPDATES**

# ANDHRA PRADESH & TELANGANA

- After COVID19, the schools are back to regular operations and we re-started our leprosy survey programmes at different schools. All the children together helped us raise INR 39,890 by spreading awareness.
- Phase II of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) has been granted for 3000 more COVID19 vaccinations.
- Organisational strategy & governance workshop was organised to 17 CSOs (Community Service Organisations) under EpiC project by FHI360.

# Presented our Active Case Finding (ACF) paper at ILEP (International Federation of Leprosy Control Associations)

#### **BIHAR**

• Through our mobile health services, 218 pairs of customised protective footwear were provided to the beneficiaries at their door step.

### MADHYA PRADESH

- Organised a training session on Disability Prevention & Medical Rehabilitation (DPMR) to 32 post graduate students of medicine and skin at AIIMS, Bhopal.
- Technical training provided to 132 prison health care workers at Jail Training Centre, Bhopal to ensure regular HIV & TB screening and other treatment support.
- 21 reconstructive surgeries were done to the people affected by leprosy.

#### **ODISHA**

- Livelihood and skill development training to leprosy affected beneficiaries
  - 17 persons were provided with a 2-day training session on how to prepare incense sticks
  - 22 persons were provided with skill development on gardening and poultry farming techniques

#### **EYECARE**

- 2116 cataract surgeries were performed at our eyecare hospitals MNC (Mahanadi Netra Chikitsalaya) in Sonepur & JNC (Junagarh Netra Chikitsalaya) in Junagarh.
- With the support of Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) Golden Jubilee Foundations, the inauguration function was done to construct a 50-bedded patient dormitory.
- Certificate renewal of SIRO (Scientific & Industrial Research Organisations) recognised by DSIR (Department of Scientific & Industrial Research) has been successfully completed.

RESEARCH

• Three new ICMR (Indian Council of Medical Research) projects have been granted and the initiation process is underway.

Kishan Rao is with LEPRA Society since 1997 who joined as a non-medical supervisor and currently, he is working as a physio technician.

How long have you been working in the field of leprosy and your observations?

I have been working in the field of leprosy for over 25 years now. Back then, there were no sufficient medical practitioners to diagnose leprosy and it was a big challenge for us to attend to a larger population. And also, the medication provided was very limited and later in 1984, Multi-Drug Therapy (MDT) was introduced and it helped many people which is still being continued as an effective medicine regime.

#### How do you feel when you interact with beneficiaries who were treated years ago?

Some of the beneficiaries have become like my family members and I met very good people who are my friends even now. Even the families of the beneficiary are grateful to us since we help them not only with treatment for leprosy but also support in linking to govt. schemes, provide education support, counselling to family members etc. On an overall, it was a wonderful journey filled with many sweet experiences.

#### What do you like the most about working with LEPRA?

After coming to LEPRA, I had the opportunity to complete my Masters in Sociology and helped me grow in my career. I am glad that I work in a disease area leprosy which many of the general public are not aware of. And I get a chance to interact with the beneficiaries and also spread more awareness wherever I go.

We closed our year-end in March with a successful completion MC (Members of Committee) & GB (General Body) meeting. Apart from observing International Women's Day, our teams at all project locations organised the World TB Day specific activities with a pledge



to scale up our activities to eliminate TB. I participated in the ground-breaking ceremony of constructing a dormitory supported by Life Insurance Corporation (LIC) of India - Golden Jubilee Foundation, at our eye care hospital - Mahanadi Netra Chikitsalaya (MNC), in Sonepur, Odisha. One of the highlights was attending the Swabhiman review meeting at the recently renovated Sonepur Care Centre (SCC). I also had the opportunity to spend some time with the in-patients (5 male and 2 female) and realised how crucial it was for us to re-start the facility. I want to convey the message of gratitude which a patient shared with me. He said his feet were about to get amputated at a govt. hospital and he was saved this amputation by the ulcer/self care techniques & treatment he received from SCC and he is now well on his way to recovery - click here to read the story.
