

- ASHA awareness programme & POD camps in NTR district and Krishna district.
- In Bihar , Team LEPRA & Sightsavers conducted IEC plus eye-care mobile health camps in the slums and leprosy colonies in Patna.

The IEC focus was on health, education and signs and symptoms of Leprosy and importance of preventing the skin from drying & cracking to further prevent from recurrent ulcers.

Screening for refractive errors and spectacles provision was taken up for commercial drivers under RAHI project in Patna with support of UBER and Sightsavers.
- Global programme meeting took place in UK where teams from India , UK and Bangladesh took part. India team was represented by Prasant , Arun and Rajni.



## State specific key updates

#### AP/TS/MH

- 15 of our beneficiaries affected with Leprosy, LF, and HIV were supported with livelihood promotional activities to various local donations and CSR Grants.
- Initiated Leprosy related services in Vizianagaram and Chandrapur districts in the state of Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra.
- Achieved 6000 Vaccination targets under ARPA project.

### Odisha

- PMP (Private Medical Practitioner) / RMP (Registered Medical Practitioner) sensitization on Leprosy and LF (Lymphatic Filariasis) was held at Boipariguda CHC.
- As per directions of the DPH (Doctor of Public Health) Odisha, NLEP (National Leprosy Eradication Programme), our NLEP Consultant supervised the 'Integrated house-tohouse survey' activities of Ganjam district and facilitated the activity at district & sub-district levels.
- Flood situation and need assessment of beneficiaries conducted by our LF team in Puri. We ensured that all our beneficiaries were fine and our services continued.

#### Research

- New proposal submissions and partnerships
  - BIRAC (Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council) - BMGF (Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation) -LF (Lymphatic Filariasis) diagnostics-shortlisted for final level
  - RICH (Research and Innovation Circle of Hyderabad) exploration for bio repository grant.
  - Osmania medical college, Microbiology and DVL (Department of Dermatology, Venereology and Leprosy) departments.
  - Team from from University of Florida, UK and ISB (Indian School Of Business) visited our research facilities to initiate discussions on collaboration on infrared thermography.



#### MP

- Under GFATM Phase-III program , finalized Private Medical Associations workshop with MPSACS (Madhya Pradesh State Aids Control Society) to be organised in the month of Sept 2022.
- Project orientation workshop done by SAMARTH team for block Lav-Kuch Nagar District Chhatarpur.

#### Eyecare

- 1418 cataract surgeries at our eye care hospitals MNC and JNC located in Sonepur and Junagarh.
- MNC conducted a screening camp at phulbani in collaboration with Barista Nagarika Mancha of Kandhamal district. More than 150 numbers of senior citizens screened in the camp out of which 26 numbers transported to MNC for surgical intervention.
- MOU signed with Nuapada district to carry out outreach & surgical activities. After Kalahandi & Nabarangpur, JNC has spread its wings to cater the eye care needs of the population residing in remote corners of the district.

#### Bihar

- Faciliated the TOT (Training of Trainers) on MMDP (Morbidity Management and Disability Prevention) at Rohtas district and this workship was organized by WHO.
- Under project Jagurati , the CRPs (Community Resource Persons) detected 33 cases in Kalyanpur Block and registered for treatment.
- Attended sight savers Partners meet in Bhubaneswar and Vision 2020 conference at Siliguri.

#### Leprosy and LF numbers

- Leprosy
  - 204 New Leprosy Cases Detected
  - 134 (66%) are MB
  - 45(22%) are G1& G2 Cases
  - 81 (40%) Female and 13 (6%)Children
  - 31 Cases impairments corrected.
  - 118 Patients Ulcer healed
  - 60 Patients Benefitted with SER.
- LF
  - 29 Underwent Hydrocelectomy.
  - 1245 LF Cases line-listed.
  - 290 acute attacks treated
  - 304 entry lesions treated



Nrusingha Charan Mishra presently working as a Field Coordinator at Swabhiman Project Sonepur, Odisha. He is a trained Para Medical Worker (Leprosy) and Physio technician in Leprosy since 1999. Captured below are some highlights of our conversation with him.

#### How many years have you been associated with LEPRA?

29 years !! | am with LEPRA since 30th July 1993 and worked as PMW (Para Medical Worker) for 7 years and promoted as Non-Medical Supervisor in 2000 (NMS) for 4 years. I took a break due to personal reasons and have rejoined back and since 2017 I have been continuing as FC (Field Coordinator) in Sonepur district. I enjoy working here.

#### A memory at LEPRA which you would like to share?

I really enjoy interacting and working with the people living in remote and neglected communities , especially tribals. More than speaking , I learn more when I look at their eyes and understand how difficult their lives are and yet how strong and brave they are. They motivate me to do more. We did the unforgettable work in the community in the areas of Leprosy, TB, (HIV/AIDS), Sanitation/Hygiene, Malaria and Eye care.

#### What makes LEPRA a unique organization?

In LEPRA all staff is devoted to service provider's attitude. All have well knowledge on Leprosy and also practicing honestly that makes LEPRA a unique organisation.



"I was very afraid about my eye problem as I have only one eye vision. Thankfully LEPRA staff facilitated cataract surgery free of cost. Without their help this surgery wouldn't have been possible as I could not afford it. I convey my sincere thanks to LEPRA"; says Mr. Lingala Nagendar Rao.
