With the support of EdCIL Limited, cataract surgeries were provided to 300 patients of the Mahanadi Netra Chikitsalaya (MNC) in Sonepur, Odisha. We also provided customized protective footwear to 600 beneficiaries across our operational areas in Bihar.





Our advocacy efforts paid off for the first exclusive disability certificate camp held for people with leprosy at the district hospital, Hyderabad. Out of 21 affected persons, 14 were eligible for getting a certificate. The Honble Collector issued SADAREM (Software for Assessment of Disabled for Access Rehabilitation & Empowerment) certificates to 3 disabled people, and we issued them to the remaining 11 people affected with leprosy.



On behalf of all of us at LEPRA, our deepest condolences to the family of Dr. N.K. Patnaik on his demise. He has been associated with LEPRA since 2009 and was a medical consultant at Koraput care center. He was an empathetic and passionate crusader in the fight against Leprosy and we will miss his expertise and quidance.

I was affected by Filaria and suffer from Lymphedema Grade III on my right leg. I used to suffer from acute attacks and entry lesions. After attending a Self-care camp organized by LEPRA, I was taught about the Self-care practices on a daily basis and also received customized protective footwear.

My condition is a lot better now and my entry lesions have healed. From the past 5 years I never had any acute attacks and my foot swelling has also healed. I generously thank LEPRA for their support and encouragement."
