PROJECT DISPELL

(Disability Prevention & Empowerment of Leprosy and LF Patients)

The DISPELL (Disability Prevention & Empowerment of Leprosy and LF Patients) project is a flagship program supported by Mankind Pharma's CSR initiative. This project aims to address the challenges faced by individuals affected by leprosy and LF, including physical disabilities, stigma, and limited access to care. Operating in seven locations across India, DISPELL focuses on early diagnosis, specialized treatment, disability prevention, and community empowerment. The project's core strength lies in its holistic approach, combining medical services, advocacy, and rehabilitation to create lasting impacts.



PROJECT DISPELL

(Disability Prevention & Empowerment of Leprosy and LF Patients)

Objectives

- Enhance Leprosy and Lymphatic Filariasis Case Detection.
- Provide specialized treatment for complications.
- Strengthen Comprehensive Disability Care Centre services for Leprosy and Elephantiasis/Lymphatic Filariasis.
- Support health authorities in training General Health Staff and Private Health Providers on Leprosy and Elephantiasis/Lymphatic Filariasis to strengthen case detection/services.
- Facilitate Hydrocele and Reconstructive services.
- Provide and promote protective/appropriate footwear and prostheses to persons in need.
- Provide continuing medical education/counseling to the affected persons and families.
 - Skill transfer through partnering.
 - Enhance capacities of government.
 - Staff to manage reactions/neuritis, management of ulcers/wounds, and teaching self-care practices in Gr-II disability.
 - Promote Community Based Rehabilitation through Patient Support Groups.





Comprehensive Disability Care Centres (CDCCs)


CDCCs are pivotal in delivering specialized care under the DISPELL project. These centres are designed to address the medical and rehabilitative needs of patients affected by leprosy and LF. Key services offered at CDCCs include:



- Awareness and training programs for patients, caregivers, and healthcare workers.
- Diagnosis and treatment of complications such as ulcers and deformities.
- Surgical interventions for patients requiring reconstructive procedures.
- Physiotherapy and provision of assistive devices to enhance mobility.
- Follow-up care to monitor patient recovery and prevent further disabilities.
- CDCCs serve as a comprehensive hub for medical care, rehabilitation, and community engagement, ensuring that individuals receive holistic support.



Mr. Debo Jani, a 40-year-old resident of Jayanagar, Jeypore, was diagnosed with leprosy at UGPHC, Jagadhatripur, and referred to LEPRA for further evaluation. Struggling with a Type-1 reaction, ulnar weakness in his left hand, and a right foot ulcer, he faced immense challenges, including the loss of his livelihood as a laborer. With continuous support, he received MDT treatment, physiotherapy, a lumbrical slab, and G2 footwear, along with regular follow-ups and motivation for reconstructive surgery. Mankind Pharma played a crucial role in providing medical supplies, rehabilitation support, and awareness, helping him navigate his journey toward recovery. Through coordinated efforts, he also secured a disability certificate and now receives a pension, easing some of his financial burdens.



"I have faced many struggles, from losing my ability to work to feeling hopeless about my future. But now, with the right treatment, support, and the upcoming reconstructive surgery, I see hope again. I am eager to regain the strength in my hand and rebuild my life."

Mr. Saiba Mali, a 40-year-old resident of Semlaguda village, Boriguma block, first noticed patches on his feet and legs many years ago but ignored them, continuing his daily work as a goat milk seller. Over time, ulcers developed on his legs, making it difficult for him to work. During a village survey, Lepra FC and BNLW identified him as a leprosy patient, and he immediately started treatment. As his condition progressed, he developed a Type-1 reaction and clawing of fingers, for which he was referred to CDCC for advanced care. There, he received physiotherapy and underwent reconstructive surgery, which helped improve his hand function. In recent years, recurrent foot ulcers made it challenging for him to continue his work, pushing his family into financial difficulties. He struggled to support his daughter's education and provide for his family. Mankind Pharma played a crucial role in his recovery by providing essential medical supplies, ulcer care treatment, and physiotherapy support. With their assistance, his ulcers have healed, and he is now able to resume his livelihood. His financial condition has improved, and his family is relieved and grateful.



Born into a struggling family in Thariat village, 16year-old Sankar Nayak lost his father at a young age, leaving his elder sister as the sole breadwinner. When his mother noticed patches on his body, an ASHA worker referred him to CHC Parla, where he was diagnosed with leprosy and started on MDT Despite completing treatment, treatment. complicated ulcer led to the loss of his left big toe due to delayed identification and care. During a focal leprosy campaign, a field coordinator identified his case and ensured his admission to the IP ward at for advanced Koraput treatment, including dressings, foot injections, elevation. physiotherapy. With Mankind Pharma's support, he received essential medicines, specialized footwear, and guidance on long-term care. Additionally, assistance was provided for his disability certification and pension application. Now, with renewed confidence and family support, he is preparing for reconstructive surgery.

Kameswar Bhatra, a 36-year-old from Betal village in the Swabhiman project area, had to abandon his education after his father's death to support his family through daily labor. He noticed lesions on his right leg and hand, which later led to foot drop. Seeking help from a traditional without healer, he spent his savings improvement, forcing his wife to become the family's sole earner. In 2024, a friend noticed his worsening condition and connected him to the DPMR clinic, where he was diagnosed with leprosy and started MDT treatment. With Mankind Pharma's support, he received physiotherapy, medical care, and assistance in obtaining his disability certificate and pension. Now, he can resume labor work, improving his financial stability. With plans for reconstructive surgery in the upcoming camp, he and his family are optimistic about the future.



Juma Jani, a 30-year-old housewife from Dumaput village in Koraput, lives with her husband, two daughters, and her unmarried sister, Asmati, who works as a laborer. When Juma developed skin patches, her sister, having prior knowledge of leprosy, suspected the disease and took her to the local ASHA worker. She was referred to DHH Jeypore, where a specialist suspected Hansen's disease and sent her for a skin smear test at Koraput. The diagnosis was confirmed, and she was started on MDT and prednisolone therapy. Initially hesitant to stay at the hospital, Juma later sought admission when her condition worsened with a high fever and a Dapsone reaction. Further tests revealed malaria alongside her leprosy reaction, requiring immediate treatment. With Mankind Pharma's support, she received medical care, counselling, and continuous follow-ups, ensuring her full recovery. Now, she is stable and continuing MDT, hopeful for a healthier future.

Mrs. Tiki Mahapatra, a 55-year-old woman from Sauraguda village in Koraput, has been living with Lymphatic Filariasis (LF) for over 20 years. After suffering from high fever and swelling in her right foot, she sought local treatment but found no relief. She then went to the Government Medical College in Cuttack, where her fever subsided after a week of treatment. However, the symptoms returned after three years, and for the next 17 years, she faced recurring episodes of fever and edema, spending over Rs. 30,000 on treatment across multiple hospitals in Odisha and Andhra Pradesh. Through the support of Mankind Pharma's DISPELL project, she received livelihood assistance and better treatment management, leading to a significant reduction in her edema from stage 4 to stage 3. She now receives a disability pension, thanks to a disability certificate facilitated by LEPRA.



Mr. Jagannath Nag, a 32-year-old sweeper from Anta village, Koraput, began experiencing symptoms of leprosy, including anaesthesia in both legs and patches on his body. While cutting his nails, he accidentally injured his second toe and applied some medicine, but it didn't help. He sought treatment from local healers, but his condition didn't improve. In 2018, a doctor confirmed he had MB leprosy and started him on MDT. X-rays showed that his first and second toes were severely damaged, leading to surgery. However, his condition worsened due to depression following his father's death and financial struggles. After receiving continuous counseling from LEPRA staff and the Field Coordinator, he agreed to be admitted to the hospital and later referred to LEPRA Koraput. There, he received proper care, including daily dressing, medicines, and physiotherapy. After consistent treatment and support, his ulcers healed, and his condition improved.

Mr. Jagannath Harijan, a 25-year-old from Dahana village in Nandahandi, Nabrangapur, was diagnosed with leprosy, experiencing ulnar and median paralysis in both hands along with anaesthetic patches on his body. Initially seeking help at Christian Hospital and later referred to DHH, Nabrangapur, he began MDT treatment and followed guidance on physiotherapy and selfcare practices, completing his course. The LEPRA project staff regularly visited and encouraged him to undergo reconstructive surgeries. He underwent three surgeries-first for right hand ulnar palsy, then for left hand ulnar palsy, and finally for right-hand median paralysis, all of which were followed by care at the Koraput Care Center. He received financial assistance for each surgery with the generous support of Mankind Pharma. After nine months of post-operative follow-up, the results were positive, and he regained functionality in his hands.


Mr. Nadu Panka, a 48-year-old from Sana Keilari village, Nabarangpur, was diagnosed with leprosy after noticing patches on his right leg. He received MDT treatment and completed his course, being declared free from treatment (RFT). However, after completing his RFT, he developed a plantar heel ulcer on his left foot, which was treated by the Field Coordinator (FC) at his doorstep. The ulcers on both feet required around a month to heal, he was admitted to the Koraput Referral Centre (KCC) for further treatment. At KCC, he received ulcer dressing, self-care guidance, and MCR footwear. Following successful healing, he was discharged and now benefits from the Madhu Babu Pension Scheme.



"After completing RFT, I developed a plantar heel ulcer on my left foot. The staff treated it at my doorstep, and after about a month, I healed with the help of Lepra's care. Now, my family's life has improved, and I feel very grateful."

Raghunath Thakri, a 40-year-old from Jeypore, first noticed hypo-pigmented patches on his right hand and legs. He initially thought it was a simple skin condition and neglected it. Over time, the patches worsened, and his hand developed clawing, and his foot became anaesthetic, leading to significant disabilities. During a surveillance follow-up, project staff identified his condition and motivated him to seek treatment. He visited the LEPRA clinic at Jeypore, where he was diagnosed with leprosy and started on MDT. Despite completing the treatment, he continued to suffer from complications like neuropathic foot and recurrent ulcers, which led to multiple surgeries, including a right-hand claw correction and thumb operation. Later, he faced another challenge with a complicated ulcer on his right foot, prompting his visit to the Koraput CDCC, where he received comprehensive care, including physiotherapy, ulcer dressing, medications, and MCR footwear. With ongoing support from Lepra, he also received a disability certificate and pension, which helped improve his livelihood. With Mankind Pharma's assistance, Raghunath began a fruit-selling business, which provided a steady income.



Mr. Trinath Bagh, a 46-year-old from Chotaguda village, first noticed swelling and discomfort in his left foot and was diagnosed as Elephantiasis (Lymphoedema) Filariasis. Despite receiving treatment at a government hospital in Jeypore, his condition remained the same and worsened over the years. He was the sole breadwinner for his family, earning a daily wage as a cleaner and supplier at a hotel. Along with his wife, who worked as a maid, they supported their four children and a sister who was also working as a housemaid. His family was large, and with his illness affecting his ability to work, the pressure mounted, especially after his son-in-law was arrested and his family faced additional financial strain. When LEPRA staff discovered his condition at the Jeypore bus stand, they advised him to visit the DPMR clinic and Koraput Care Centre for counselling and self-care practices. He was provided with a self-care kit, proper footwear, and detailed guidance on how to manage his condition. With LEPRA's support, he secured a 40% disability certificate, qualified for a pension, and found renewed hope for a better future.

Suravi Sandhya Rani Ketriya, a 51-year-old housewife from Jeypore, endured years of pain and frustration after her leg began swelling in 1998. Despite numerous visits to private clinics and hospitals, including an unsuccessful surgery, her condition only worsened. Feeling hopeless, she gave up on seeking further treatment. Years of suffering followed, until a village ASHA worker suggested she visit Jagdalpur hospital. That was when LEPRA staff intervened, referring her to the Koraput CDCC where she was diagnosed with leprosy.

At Koraput CDCC, Suravi was not only given the correct diagnosis, but also started on the appropriate MDT treatment. She was educated on self-care practices and provided with the tools to manage her condition. With LEPRA's support, Suravi began receiving a monthly pension, alleviating the financial strain and improving her quality of life. Her health is now significantly better, and she is deeply grateful for the care and support that transformed her life.



Kuni Harijan, an 18-year-old girl from Kupia Mundi Guda in the Koraput district, comes from a family that struggles with economic hardships and health challenges. Her father, a former leprosy patient, is now retired and receives a disability pension, while the family has a small crop field. Despite this, Kuni noticed two patches on her face and neck, which were later found to be signs of leprosy during a focal survey. Though initially hesitant to seek treatment due to the lack of transportation and fear of going alone, she eventually registered for treatment at the Boriguma CHC, where she was diagnosed as a PB leprosy case and started MDT treatment. Following her registration, the whole family was screened, and her mother was diagnosed at an early stage, benefiting from early treatment. Kuni and her family are grateful to the Mankind Pharma for their support.

Khiramani Bagh, a 26-year-old woman, lives with her two young daughters and her mother in a small hut. Her husband works as a cleaner in a bike showroom, earning minimal daily wages, and does not provide support. Illiterate and unemployed, Khiramani's health further worsened when she contracted leprosy. In 2016, she first noticed numbness in her right hand and left foot, followed by severe joint pain and fever, which left her bedridden for a month. After spending a considerable amount on unsuccessful private treatment, she was referred to the Skin and VD Department of SLNMC & Hospital, Koraput, and later to LEPRA Society Koraput, where she was confirmed as a leprosy case and started on MDT. She was regularly followed up by the Lepra Field Coordinator. In 2024, she was admitted to the IP ward, where she was counseled on self-care, received physiotherapy, and was given special footwear. She later received a disability certificate in August 2024. In January 2025, she was readmitted for an ulcer on her left foot, which was treated with ulcer care, physiotherapy, and new footwear. She and her family are grateful for the support from LEPRA staff and Mankind Pharma.



Pabitra Harijan, a 12-year-old girl from Bhusanguda in the Koraput district, lives with her family, including her mother, father, and siblings. In August 2024, the village ASHA worker suspected Pabitra's condition and took her to the Kundra CHC, where the doctor confirmed she had leprosy and started her on MDT along with Prednisolone Therapy. She was referred to LEPRA Society, where she was found to have right-hand ulnar weakness and palsy, along with Type 1 reaction. A skin smear test confirmed a positive diagnosis. The LEPRA staff worked closely with her, preparing an ulnar slab for her hand and providing custom footwear, all supported by Mankind Pharma, while offering continuous support and counseling to her family. The friendly and reassuring approach helped ease the family's fears. Though Pabitra is still undergoing treatment, she and her family are now more hopeful.

Nimai Charan Majhi, a 12-year-old boy from Bargarh district, lives with his parents and two younger sisters, working hard on their ancestral farmland to grow crops like paddy and groundnuts. Despite their efforts, the family's yield was insufficient to meet their needs, and Nimai's father often worked as a daily laborer to support them. In early 2024, during a health screening at his school, Nimai was found with a patch on his face and partial anesthesia. Motivated by his father's concern, they sought treatment at the DPMR clinic, where Nimai was diagnosed with leprosy at an early stage and began MDT treatment. With continuous support from the LEPRA Swabhiman Field Coordinator and ASHA, as well as care from Mankind Pharma, Nimai is now receiving proper treatment. Although he faced deformities, his health is improving steadily.

Chandavath Punnaya Naik, a 33-year-old man, faced multiple challenges, including hypopigmented patches across his body, a non-healing ulcer on his left foot, bilateral plantar anesthesia affecting his mobility, and psychological distress due to the stigma of leprosy. LEPRA Society quickly intervened by starting multi-drug therapy (MDT) and providing regular ulcer dressing and care. He also received a self-care kit with training on how to manage his condition, along with customized MCR (Micro Cellular Rubber) footwear to reduce pressure on the ulcers. Throughout his treatment, Mankind Pharma played a crucial role by providing continuous support, ensuring that the necessary medicines and supplies were available for his care. This combination of medical intervention, footwear, self-care training, and psychological support helped Chandavath make significant progress, with his ulcer healing rapidly, mobility improving, and mental outlook becoming more hopeful. He now feels empowered and motivated for the future. Chandavath says,

Hypopigmented patches spread across his body, and severe reactions caused intense pain in his upper extremities. His condition worsened, leaving him in constant distress. When Lepra's team discovered his case, they immediately initiated multidrug therapy (MDT) and provided necessary reaction treatment. In addition, Mankind Pharma, through its support in the Mankind CSR Project, helped ensure that Rudrapati received a self-care kit, complete with essential supplies and training on how to manage his condition effectively.

With the combined efforts of Lepra and Mankind Pharma, Rudrapati saw remarkable improvement. The discoloration of his patches decreased, the pain in his upper extremities subsided, and the severity of his reactions significantly reduced. Through consistent self-care practices, he successfully prevented further deformities and regained a sense of normalcy.



Kuppili Varun Sai, a 10-year-old boy, was initially devastated by the visible hypopigmented patches on his body, a sign of leprosy. His family was engulfed in fear and psychological distress, unsure of what the future held for their child. The emotional toll was immense, as they feared the worst for him. When Lepra's team discovered Varun's case, they acted swiftly. They initiated MDT immediately to begin the treatment, and crucially, they provided the family with the emotional support they so desperately needed. Through counselling sessions, addressed the family's fears and offered muchneeded reassurance, helping them understand the disease and its treatment. With the support of Lepra and the vital assistance of Mankind Pharma through their Mankind CSR Project, which facilitated the provision of medicines and treatment resources, Varun's condition started to improve. The patches on his body subsided significantly, and the family's distress eased. psychological They gained confidence as they saw their child getting better, and hope returned to their lives.

Along with the medical they offered psychological support, motivation, helping her regain her strength and sense of hope. Through continuous encouragement and selfcare guidance, she was empowered to prevent further deformities and manage her condition effectively. With Mankind Pharma's support through its CSR initiative, Shaik Chaand Bee's condition improved significantly, with 80% of her patches subsiding. Now healthier and stronger, she embraces life with renewed hope and confidence, caring for her family.



Abdul Shareefunnessa, a 39-year-old woman, had been living with the debilitating effects of leprosy for years. As a multibacillary (MB) case, she suffered from a severe right-hand ulnar claw hand deformity that greatly affected her daily life. Despite consulting numerous doctors, she could not find relief, and the deformity hindered her ability to perform basic tasks. When the team from Lepra intervened, they facilitated reconstructive surgery with the support of Mankind Pharma, offering a new lease on life for Abdul Shareefunnessa. Alongside the surgery, she received essential pre- and post-operative physiotherapy, including the use of splints and hydrotherapy, to ensure proper recovery and restore hand functionality. surgery corrected Abdul Shareefunnessa's The deformity, restoring strength and mobility in her hand, allowing her to perform daily tasks with ease. Mankind Pharma's CSR initiative played a vital role by providing essential medications, materials, and medical support for her recovery. Thanks to the collaboration between Lepra and Mankind Pharma, she has regained her independence, confidence, and a renewed sense of hope for the future.

With regular homebased self-care practices and proper ulcer dressing, the infected ulcer on her right foot began to heal. Her family played a key role in supporting her efforts, and within a month, follow-up visits showed that the ulcer had notably reduced in severity. Salai became a model in Dhatkidini village, educating fellow leprosy patients about the importance of self-care and hygiene. Her transformation not only improved her quality of life but also inspired others in her community to adopt self-care practices for better health outcomes.



Niranjana Among, a 42-year-old daily labourer from Sankumura village, faced significant challenges due to a long-standing condition of foot drop. This impairment prevented him from working, leaving his family reliant on his wife's earnings, as both he and his wife were illiterate. For 25 years, Niranjana had also struggled with hydrocele, which further compounded his difficulties. Living in a community where 80% of the population depended on labour work, Niranjana was burdened by selfstigma and fear regarding treatment options. Despite being informed about the availability of free reconstructive surgery (RCS) through government facilities, he initially resisted seeking help, leading to ongoing financial and emotional strain for his family. With Mankind Pharma intervention, Niranjana Among underwent successful (RCS) at Baripada DHH. With newfound mobility, he was able to resume his daily labour work just two months later. This transformation not only improved his ability to support his family but also restored his confidence and independence. After discussions with an ASHA worker, Arjun learned about the importance of self-care and the available treatments for leprosy. A follow-up visit confirmed a noticeable reduction in swelling, underscoring her commitment to managing her health. Now, Sumitra has become an inspiration within her community, educating other L.F. patients in Kumudasole about the critical role of self-care. Parao Soren, a 60-year-old man from Tuighutu village, faced significant challenges after being affected by leprosy, which led to the loss of his ability to work and forced his to rely on his son for financial support. As a member of a Below Poverty Line household, their income became unstable, with her son managing labour work to sustain the family. Despite his condition, Parao struggled with irregular intake of MDT, which increased the risk of further nerve involvement. Due to limited access to healthcare, Parao's situation emphasized the urgent need for better health education. However, after receiving support from ASHA and Lepra staff, he began receiving counselling and guidance, which paved the way for his recovery and empowerment within his community. After receiving the intervention, Parao Soren's condition showed remarkable improvement. Regular home visits ensured proper ulcer dressing, health education, and guidance on self-care practices. With her family's encouragement and the support she received, she diligently followed a care routine, leading to significant healing of her ulcer within a month. Now, Patarki has become a role model in Uparbeda village, spreading awareness about leprosy care and encouraging others to seek proper treatment.



Barisa Hembram, a 27-year-old from Ichadihi village, struggled for five years after leprosy led to a right foot drop, leaving him unable to work. As a member of a Below Poverty Line (BPL) household, losing his daily wages severely impacted his financial stability. Though he had studied up to the 9th grade, the stigma surrounding his condition pushed him into isolation, preventing him from participating in village activities. Despite receiving initial self-care education from ASHA workers, Barisa found it difficult to maintain a consistent care routine.

With limited access to healthcare, she turned to local quacks, unaware of the critical need for proper treatment. The lack of guidance impacted not only her health but also her self-esteem and participation in social activities. With the support of Mankind Pharma, Lepra Society and ASHA workers provided Jaleswori with regular follow-ups, health education, and self-care training. She gradually adopted proper MDT adherence and hygiene practices, leading to visible improvements in her condition. Encouraged by her family, she regained confidence and actively participated in awareness sessions, spreading knowledge about leprosy and its treatment. Today, she serves as an inspiration in her community, proving that timely intervention and support can break the cycle of stigma and suffering.

The provision of specialized footwear not only improved his mobility but also restored his confidence. Today, Paremeswor is not just on the path to recovery but is also an inspiration to others in his village. He actively shares his knowledge of self-care practices with fellow leprosy-affected individuals, ensuring that no one else suffers as he once did.

The referral center team provided essential counseling on caring for his ulcers and anaesthetic limbs, teaching him self-care practices. After consistent follow-up and care, Velku was referred for reconstructive surgery at the Sanawad surgical center. After his surgery for the left ulnar clawing, the coordination of his fingers improved, and both the appearance and function of his hands showed significant progress. Velku is also planning to visit Sanawad for the correction of his right hand, following the guidance of the referral center team. Velku's story demonstrates the transformative effect of timely medical intervention and the invaluable support of Mankind Pharma in improving the lives of individuals affected by leprosy.


